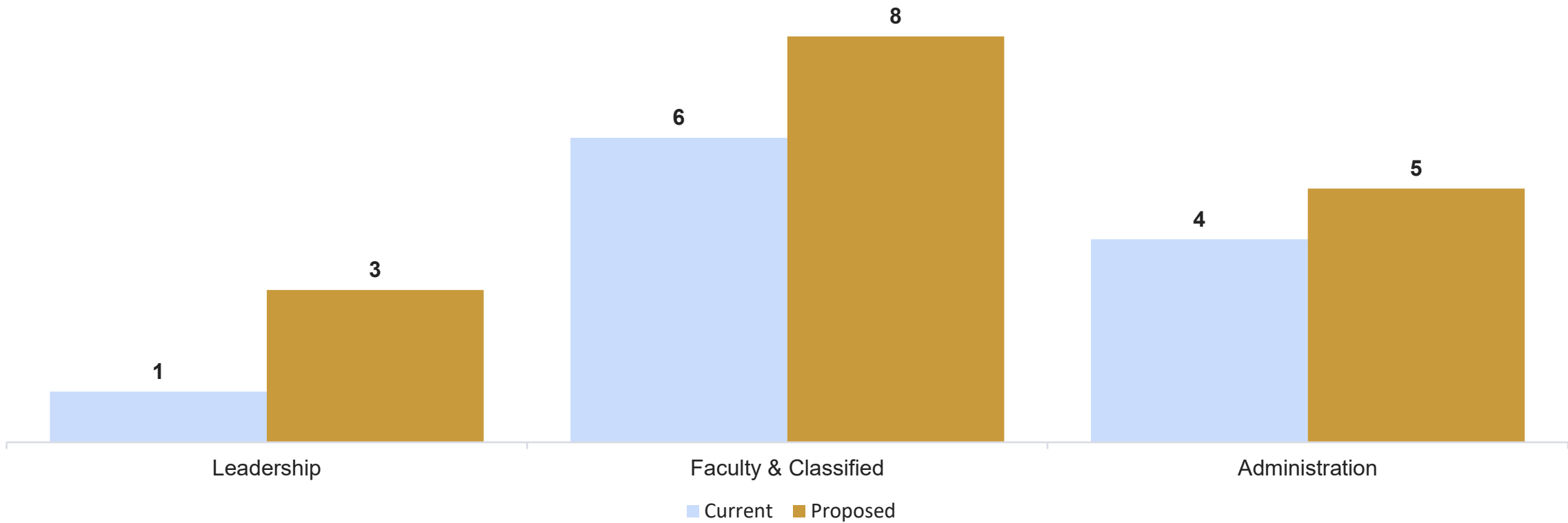

How the Structure Shifts

Comparable seat groups, current vs. proposed



Current total (14) also includes 1 Associated Student Representative seat and 2 non-voting consultants, not shown above. Proposed total is 16 seats across the three groups shown.

What Changes

Key structural differences in the proposed composition

1

Shared leadership

One Chair becomes three Co-Chairs — Administrative Services, Academic Senate, and Classified Professionals leading jointly.

2

Guaranteed faculty-classified parity

The single combined bloc grows to an even 4 Faculty + 4 Classified Professionals, up from 3 and 3.

3

Every school represented

All schools have a seat at the table, via either Faculty or Dean representation.

4

Student Services seat in Administration

The 5 Administrative seats explicitly reserve 1 for Student Services, formalizing a voice not named in the current roster.
