



Intersession and Spring 2026

We have two more weeks until the Holiday break, so all eyes are on Intersession 2026 enrollment. We did see 60 more students enroll in a course; however, this still has us down in headcount compared to the same time last year. Our current headcount is 2,163 compared to 2,406 last year, and FTES is currently at 274 compared to 306 FTES this same day last year. We are currently working on a plan to potentially open up our in-demand courses and will be reviewing the potential next steps. Our Spring 2026 enrollment numbers continue to look positive, with an additional 2,378 students enrolling since last week, bringing our headcount to 14,916. FTES is at 4,563, bringing us 79% of the way to our Spring FTES goals.

This past month, the Math Engineering Science Achievement (MESA) Program provided students with three hands-on opportunities to explore STEM careers, engage with real-world research environments, and learn about pathways available right here in San Diego. Through industry visits (MESA Shadow Day), research-focused experiences (Salk Institute), and a dedicated session with the MESA Program at San Diego State University, MESA scholars gained valuable insight into local STEM career options and SDSU programs tailored for community college transfer students. These experiences help our students make informed decisions about their academic and career journeys while building connections with professionals and university partners.
















OFFICE OF Administrative Services

OFFICE OF Institutional Effectiveness

The Office of Institutional Effectiveness is excited to announce the launch of the redesigned Transfer Volume Dashboard, an interactive tool that provides a comprehensive view of Mesa College students who successfully transferred to four-year universities using the Student-Centered Funding Formula (SCFF) methodology.

This dashboard allows users to:

Explore annual transfer trends, top university destinations, and common majors pursued by Mesa transfer students.

Examine efficiency metrics, including time to transfer and units earned.

Analyze equity gaps to understand whether transfer outcomes are proportional across student populations.

These insights support institutional planning, illuminate key student pathways, and help the college strengthen strategies that promote equitable and timely transfer for all students.


